ABSTRACT POLICY AND SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Abstract Submission Deadline: Sunday, March 16, 2025, 11:59 PM PDT

Please review the guidelines below as you prepare to submit your abstract. Please read carefully prior to beginning your abstract submission. If you have questions about abstract submissions, please email the Ashley McCowan via email at amccowan@myana.org.

- To begin, if you are an ANA Member, please click on the "Sign in with your ANA Credentials". You will be taken to the Attendee Interactive platform.
- If you are a non-member, please click on the "Non-member Sign in" and proceed to create a profile. Once inside the Attendee Interactive platform, you will be able to submit your abstract. The form will guide you through the process.
- You can log off and return to continue your abstract submission work at any time prior to the submission deadline.
- All abstracts must be completed by the submission deadline of Sunday, March 16, 2025, 11:59 PM PDT. Any abstract that has a "Incomplete" or "Withdrawn" status will not be included in the review process or included in the program for the meeting.
- Please verify that your abstract is correct and complete by clicking "View Submissions" in the "My Submissions" area of your Attendee Interactive dashboard. Please review your abstract submission to ensure the information is complete and accurate. Once the submission site closes, no further edits will be permitted.
- Once you submit your abstract, you will receive an email from Attendee Interactive confirming you have submitted your abstract.
- Submissions are not considered complete until payment is received. Please be sure to complete the payment process provided in the submission confirmation email.
- If you give your Attendee Interactive account information to another person, please note that they will have access to edit all abstracts you have submitted for review/consideration.
- All notifications are sent to the primary author/contact. It is the responsibility of the primary author/contact to communicate with any and all co-authors as necessary.
- The abstract word limit is 400, which includes words in the abstract body. Spaces are not included. If you use any special symbols or characters in the abstract, please use the dropdown boxes to pull up the characters needed.
- When citing references, provide the name of the first author, the title of the book or the name of the journal, and the year in which it was published.
- No illustrations, figures, images, tables, graphs are to be included.
- Your abstract will be printed <u>exactly as it has been submitted</u>. <u>ANA staff will not review, or update</u> submitted abstracts. Please review all content for grammar, spelling, etc.
- All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will
 evaluate submissions based on the following criteria and will assess overall merit within the context of the
 specific academic discipline:
 - Scientific, clinical, or intellectual quality of the information presented.
 - Importance and relevance of the topic.
 - Recommendation based on appraisal of the value of the presentation to the meeting, including the quality, expertise, and diversity of presenters, and the consistency of the proposal with the meeting theme as well as proposal content.
- The individual listed as the point of contact/primary author will receive all email communications regarding whether the abstract has been accepted or declined. If the abstract is accepted, the designated point of contact/primary author will need to:

- o Access the notification letter using the link provided in the "Abstract Submission Status" email.
- Utilize the RSVP feature in the notification email to convey you "Accept" or "Decline" the invitation.
- Authors of accepted abstracts will be notified by Friday, June 20, 2025. The email will originate from Attendee Interactive.
- If you do not see an email notification regarding the status of your abstract(s) by Friday, June 20, 2025, please be sure to check your spam folder.
- All abstract presenters must register for the meeting and will be required to pay the Annual Meeting registration fee. We recommend that you become an ANA member if you are not already in ANA membership. This will provide a significant savings for the ANA2025 meeting registration.
- All accepted abstracts will be published in the *Annals of Neurology*, an official journal of the ANA.
- ANA members and non-members are welcome to submit abstracts. Acceptance of abstracts will be based entirely upon quality.
- The ANA will consider research that has been previously presented at another meeting but should be modified to reflect further developments and/or to apply to the ANA audience.
- The abstract submission deadline, **Sunday, March 16, 2025, 11:59 PM PDT**, will remain firm and any abstracts received after the deadline will not be accepted.
- Authors of accepted abstracts will be notified by June 20, 2025.
- Abstract submission fees are listed below. Payment is determined by the submitter's ANA membership account status.
- Important Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission portal. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting. ANA staff are not responsible for editing abstracts. Please remember selected abstracts will be published in the Annals of Neurology.

Domestic Fellow | \$425/year

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Promotion to associate professor, full professor or chair of an ACGME-accredited or Canadian equivalent neurology department
- A neuroscientist devoted to advancing the goals of academic neurology with an appointment as an associate professor, full professor or chair in a basic or clinical department at an institution with an ACGME-approved or Canadian equivalent.

Corresponding Fellow | \$340/year Developing Country Fellow | Free

Corresponding Fellows reside outside of the United States or Canada and who have received their first promotion to the position of the equivalent of the United States or Canadian associate professor, full professor, or Chair at an ACGME equivalent institution.

Domestic Member | \$200/year ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Individuals appointed to their first faculty position in an ACGME-accredited or Canadian equivalent neurology department in the United States or Canada.
- Neuroscientists in their first faculty position in any basic or clinical department at an institution with an ACGME-approved or Canadian equivalent neurology department in the United States or Canada.

Corresponding Member | \$200/year Developing Country Member | Free

Corresponding Members reside outside of the United States or Canada and who have attained a full-time faculty position at a recognized institution. Open to individuals holding an MD, PhD, MD/PhD degree engaged in an organized training program at ACGME-equivalent accredited neurology or neuroscience-related department.

Associate | \$50/year

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Open to MD, PhD, MD/PhD degree holders in an organized training program at an ACGME-accredited neurology or neuroscience-related department.
- Proof of enrollment in an organized training program or a lab supervisor's confirmation is required each year.

Corresponding Associate | \$50/year Developing Country Associate* | Free

Individuals holding an MD, PhD, MD/PhD degree engaged in an organized training program at ACGME-accredited *equivalent* neurology or neuroscience-related department.

Student | FREE

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- · Open to MD, PhD, MD/PhD or undergraduate students.
- Proof of student status required each year.

Senior | \$100/year

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Senior Fellows are those Fellows who have attained the age of 70, are no longer active in the field of neurology, and who have requested a change in membership status.
